

DARK TIMES: A WARNING (Part 1)

A while back I wrote a bulletin article about truth where I posed that while we live in the 'age of information', there is so much that we hear, read and are told about that is false, yet is presented as truth just the same. Our times are so polarized by design as we are led to believe that racism, misogyny, bigotry, and most anything you can think of, are at staggering levels while in reality it is so much spin. I saw a great t-shirt that read: 'Make 1984 fiction again'. In so many ways I believe we are seeing the unfolding of George Orwell's book, 1984. Propaganda is common place in the modern media age as there is a slant on the news, catering to those who line their pockets. The oh-so-very-sudden hysteria over climate change finds us ready to throw away our cars, get rid of natural gas fireplaces, stoves and barbecues, and much, much more, all because we, since five minutes ago, have been 'told' that we've got to save the planet. Everywhere you look someone is pointing to the supposed signs of climate change and telling us we will have to get rid of meat consumption and eat bugs and a cacophony of other restrictions and changes they're dead serious about.

In a 2019 documentary, put out by a leading subscription-based streaming service, a difficult to watch scene shows walruses that appear to be committing a kind of suicide as they plunge to their deaths from a rock height due to, as the famous voice narration explains, a lack of sea ice. Why? Climate change. What the documentary failed to show (and has since been exposed for) was the polar bears at the top of the rock height that forced the walruses to crowd each other to the rock edge and ultimately, to their deaths. A fake narrative is posed as yet another of the endless reasons we have to save the planet and change most everything in our lives to do it. We are left to 'pick and choose' what we believe and what we don't, what we're afraid of and that which we are not. And why would I as a priest be discussing such things in a parish bulletin? Simple. Because, as Catholics, we are to be a people who follow the One who IS TRUTH itself, as Jesus Himself had said and says to us still in the Living Word proclaimed each Sunday at Mass.

We have lived through the past almost four years witnessing what no generation before us has seen before in the Covid-19 pandemic. Though it started out as such, it wasn't just a virus that was going around and the threat of unknown numbers of people who might die but, as we saw, it was about far more as it divided people and nations, brought out the best and the worst in citizens, ruined economies, and created much fear. And now we are left thinking, no matter how you view the world situation at present, what's next?

But our salvation won't come from a prime minister or a president, nor will it be found in some self-appointed world dictator or unelected bureaucrat or billionaire: it has and will only come from Jesus Christ who IS THE TRUTH.

In my former parish, I had hired a Polish-born woman who, with her husband, had two decades before, come to Canada to work for a major company. They came here for what was supposed to be a 2-year work assignment, only to fall in love with this country and its natural, expansive beauty, it's freedom and good governance, its high standard of living and education, along with many other outstanding features and attractive assets that were calling them to make this great land their home. And so, they decided to stay and become Canadians. And this they did as they gave birth to children and raised their family, bought a house, worked hard, made many friends and became active members of the several Catholic parishes they lived in. They were proud, contributing, God-fearing Canadians. Their two

boys had become active in the Polish Scouts in Canada, altar servers, lectors and members in parish youth ministry. Their oldest boy was a competitive swimmer and among the top in the sport in Ontario for his age group. This woman was gifted and able to manage or organize anything she put her mind to. She, along with her family, were widely known, respected and loved in many circles.

But in September of 2022, after selling their house and cottage, they packed up their lives and their children, and they left Canada and, like so many others I have known, including here in Collingwood, moved back to Poland at a time when even its neighbouring country was at war. Why? Because having lived under communism before, they saw the signs of communism creeping in here and were amazed that Canadians couldn't see it. And all of their Canadian friends who had come to know and love them were filled with grief as this faithful, hard-working, giving family, left Canada. And would they think for a moment that the government of Canada would care they left? No.

In the 1940's and 50's, Bishop Fulton Sheen spoke out sharply against the ideology and evils of Communism, Fascism and godlessness at a time in American history when those things seemed to be threats of the past. But Sheen, in his prophetic wisdom, was speaking to the people into the future, to us living now, and is more of a warning voice to our times than he was in his own. In the March 16, 1936 New York Times, Sheen wrote: "Why can't the modern mind see there is nothing new in communism? It is a groan of despair, not the revolution, that starts a new age. It is the logical development of civilization which for the last 400 years has been forgetting God".

"Forgetting God" is putting it mildly as a recent Research Co. survey showed that 28% of Canadians polled favoured MAID as an option for the homeless, and the place with the highest deaths in the world through doctor-assisted suicide is now Quebec, Canada with a staggering 7% of all deaths being through MAID.

The high-jacked rainbow symbol appears everywhere, even in Catholic institutions, contrary to Catholic faith and the teaching of Jesus Christ, yet pride in our country and what it has always stood for is waning. In 1938, Bishop Sheen told a rally at Carnegie Hall that: "We were silent before when 2,000,000 kulaks met death and 60,000 churches were closed by an atheistic government in Russia; we were silent before when 20,000 churches and chapels were desecrated, burned and pillaged and when 6,000 diocesan clergy were murdered in Spain. ... Those who cannot pull God down from heaven are driving his creatures from the face of the earth."

And as the Book of Ecclesiastes tells us, "There is nothing new under the sun" (Eccl. 1:9) because history repeats itself. They are, as Sheen had said, "old sins with new (progressive) labels". He saw the Catholic Church as "a house built on the immutable rock with an abiding proprietor, Peter, who has a key that admits strangers. The reactionaries want the rock without the keys, the liberals want the keys without the rock; and we who believe in Christ, who gave both to Peter, want both." Or we should.

I'm all for optimism but it must be rooted in both reality and truth. Things aren't getting better and better nor do I personally think they will. Heaven has been warning us for the past 100-years and most emphatically in recent times that we have greatly offended God and must repent and return to Him. Yet, many, it would seem, don't want God at all or certainly not the God of Jesus Christ who is demand, and calls us to repentance, conversion and life. So many godless voices clamor for our attention as they tell us that this is all ours, we're ruining it and, therefore, we need to ruin our lives for its restoration. Everything, and most uniquely us, belong to God, who is Truth. (FrC)




