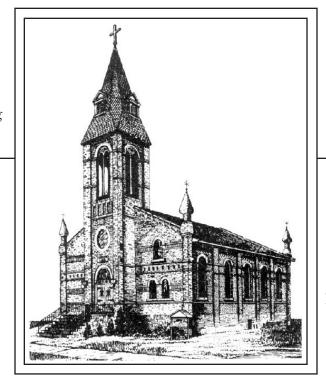

SOME GOOD QUESTIONS

There are many questions we Catholics have over the things we say in our creeds and in what we pray in the Mass. Some of these we get to pondering and perhaps even wonder whether we are the only ones who don't know the answer to the baffling query we have about an article of faith or a statement expressive of our belief. The following are two questions I have heard people asking.

Why do we say in the Creed that Jesus "rose <u>again</u> from the dead..."? Doesn't the word "again" suggest that He rose before?



This is a very good question and not only well worth asking but also worth knowing about.

In English, the word 'again' often means a repeat of a previously committed act, something we've done repeatedly. If I say that I had been to the fair last night and I intend to "go back again" tonight, the 'again' refers to a repeat of what I did yesterday. But Jesus didn't

rise before or at any earlier time, so why use the word 'again' instead of just saying, "On the third day He rose..."? If you remember the one hit wonder from the band Chumbawamba from a few decades ago called *Tubthumping*, you might remember the following lyrics,

"I get knocked down but I get up again...

You are never going to keep me down".

The word 'again found in the song doesn't necessarily suggest that the singer has been knocked down before, in fact, the 'again' could refer to the man returning to the state he was in before he got knocked down. 'He would only need to have been knocked down once to be able to still use the word 'again'. In the same way, Jesus didn't rise at previous times but the 'again' clearly refers to His return to the way He was before He was crucified. He was alive, then dead, and rose from the dead and is alive 'again'. So, Jesus rose again in return to His previous state of being.

Another good question is

If the Catholic Church holds that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, had no other children and, therefore, remained a Virgin, how come scripture says that "she gave birth to her <u>first-born son</u>"?



Again, in our use of the English language, we might assume that the word 'first' automatically means that there may have been other subsequent children, but this is not always so. When we used the word 'first' to refer to First Communion, for example, it implies that the first Communion of a child or adult will be followed by a life-long series of Communion, receiving (which,

sadly, isn't always the case). But the word 'first' when taken in the opposite direction can also refer not to things that have followed by things that have come before and therefore to the fact that Mary had never given birth to a child before she conceived and gave birth to the Son of God, Jesus.

Obviously, when we put together the scriptures of the Old Testament, which speak of the coming Son of Man, the Suffering Servant, the Messiah, they all refer to God's plan of saving His people, ultimately by sending His own Son into the world as Messiah and Saviour. Mary conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit – an extraordinary event that had never come before or since to any woman of the earth, but was first conceived in her mother's womb free from the stain of sin. Therefore, no one could ever hold that Jesus was conceived like all humans and therefore knew sin. His Blessed Mother was protected by God's design and will from having or knowing sin so that her Son would be brought into the world the pure and clean vessel that He was, for He is "God from God".

Also, if Mary had other children after she gave birth to Jesus, then why was she not commended to them by Jesus from the Cross? Instead, He said to John: "Behold your Mother". And the scripture records that from that day on Mary lived with John the disciple of Jesus. Mary would live with her children upon the death of her Son, Jesus and not with one of her Son's co-workers. But as there were no other children, Mary is commended to an Apostle who represents both priesthood and the Church and John, as representative of both, was commended to Jesus' Mother, Mary. Mary is our mother too.

So, 'first-born' refers to Mary never having had a child before Jesus and the Church holds, and with good and sound reason, that she never had any others after Jesus. (*Fr. Charles*)

Never assume that those who have died just simply went to heaven because we love them. Our love and care for them should move us to continually pray for them and all the souls in purgatory, that place and time of cleansing.

and all the sacrifices of the Holy Mass, Communions, prayers and good works,

which shall be accomplished today throughout the world. Amen.


