

ADVENT: Getting Ready... for What?



Prior to both the ecclesial seasons of Christmas and Easter we have what could be called "preparation times" when we look to making changes within us in anticipation of the joyful season to be celebrated. These times are a kind of rehearsal for the really real event of being a loyal follower, believer and close friend of the Lord Jesus Christ. Advent,

obviously, is one of those times of preparation because, otherwise, I wouldn't be writing about it at all. Yet it deserves not only bulletin space attention but far more important focus as we prepare for Christmas. But that's not the 25th of December kind of Christmas, when all our hectic both joyful and more stressing busyness finally comes to a ready-or-not conclusion, but Christmas that is eight days of unpacking the mystery that is the Incarnation. We'd have to admit that just when the Church begins to celebrate Christmas in its true sense and nature, the world is finished with it because it has already been 'celebrating' a tinsel form of it already for six weeks or longer; the tree's been up for a month or more and we've heard wintery music with the word Christmas thrown in to remind us what this season is really not all about. (I've always found it curious that while Jingle Bells, Frosty the Snowman and White Christmas and many others are played continuously during the season of Advent, once December 25th comes you won't hear any of them the following day even though they are more fittingly winter songs - and we all know winter isn't over on December 25th, though I wish...).

So, at a time when there is much preparation in anticipation of a single day we are being asked to prepare for the coming of Christ in history, mystery and at a time we do not know over these next four weeks of Advent. Yes, Christ came *in history* which is recounted at Christmas at the very core of its meaning, but that coming hit humanity with such force that it was split in two in that even those who do not believe in God still mark their lives according to Jesus' coming 2000 years ago in BC and AD. BC represents 'Before Christ' and previous to the Incarnation all time and historical significance was and is marked by Jesus at the center of all things while AD (Anno Domini) means Year of Our Lord which tells us that Jesus' coming has split history in two and our progression in days, months and years dates back to His coming to the earth as the Messiah. So, this is rightly the first coming.

Then we are told of the reality that Christ comes to us also <u>in mystery</u> in that every day, every moment in fact, calls us into a living relationship with Jesus. Our present life with Jesus is one of experiencing in the relationship His first coming has blessed us with and most especially we experience Him in the mystery of the Eucharist, though it remains a mystery how this is possible, but it is.

The Church herself is part of that mystery for she was founded by Christ and is sustained by Him until He comes again at a time and date we do not know. Many signs are observable today which more than suggest this could be a possibility during our life time and this brings us to our final coming of the Lord – in His Second Coming. It is for this Second Coming, as Jesus had promised us, that the Church's very catechism speaks of what will take place at that time:

675 "Before Christ's second coming the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers. The persecution that accompanies here pilgrimage on earth will unveil the 'mystery of iniquity" in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth. The supreme religious deception is that of the Antichrist, a pseudo-messianism by which man glorifies himself in place of God and of his Messiah come in the flesh."

In every age, man has been and is called to preparation for a life with Jesus in this life and in the fullness of the life that is to come. No one else can promise and deliver on what Christ has revealed to us. To think of Christmas as merely a hectic paced season leading up to a day when we remember that Jesus was born of Mary will leave us with a December 25th singing of Happy Birthday, Jesus, and that's it and nothing more in a walk-on part of a man called The Christ. No, what Jesus brought and gives can't be returned to the store nor can we purchase it with our finite money or our wealth. It can only be accepted as pure gift, free of charge by the God who has already in our individual creation, created us for Himself - hardwired us for none other than Him and forever. If we choose not God than we also choose no forever for ourselves. Thus, the importance of preparation in the grace of this season of Advent when we accept again the God of Jesus Christ who came to the earth as one like us and who continues to come to us only upon our openness and welcome of Him into our lives, and who will come again as both Saviour and Judge at the culmination of all things. 
