


SHOW RESPECT. GENUFLECT.

In 2009, when I had first arrived at my last parish assignment, I was concerned about where the Tabernacle had been placed. The large church had a seating capacity of over 800 with large, wide aisles and an expanse of a sanctuary. Yet the Tabernacle was placed to the left side of the sanctuary, just one-step above the main floor of the church while the presiding priest would sit in the sanctuary, about seven-steps above the main floor, directly below a large, bronze statue of the Resurrection that weighed ¾ of a ton which was perched on an unsupported 'baldacino'. (I used to think that if I ever heard so much as a creak from above me, I would be out of that chair and hurdle the altar so fast....) But what I quickly observed with the Tabernacle placement, which was right next to an exit door from the church to the parish hall, was that almost no one genuflected. Even when Mass was over and there was a breakfast in the hall, some people would walk right by and not so much as even notice the Tabernacle bearing the Real Presence of Jesus on the earth, in our midst, right in front of us. So, I hung a simple sign that bore the words above: Show Respect. Genuflect to remind everyone that we should always show reverence and the greatest respect to Jesus in the Tabernacle, whether we are arriving or leaving or simply passing by.

In time, after working on a restoration of respect and attention to the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle, I sought and received permission to move the Tabernacle to its rightful place in the center of the sanctuary, rightfully occupying the place the priest used to sit. When I did so, I heard nothing but positive remarks from parishioners about the Tabernacle now being at the center of the sanctuary and in the place of prominence where it could be visibly seen from every angle and from every aisle of approach. This change brought about a visible change in the way parishioners responded to the Real Presence.

Genuflection is made by, from a standing position, dropping the right knee to the floor while the left knee is held at a 45-degree angle, accompanied by a slight bow of the head toward the Tabernacle. The sign of the cross need not be made but this simple gesture by itself demonstrates due reverence and recognition that Jesus is here in the Tabernacle as we are arriving or leaving our pew. Sometimes due to habit, people will make a half-attempt at a genuflection which looks more like they almost tripped, which is kind of funny. Yet a genuflection is simply the right knee to the floor and rising again before entering your pew or when leaving your pew, except for Communion. As well, sometimes communicants will receive the Body of Christ and then step aside and genuflect to the Tabernacle. While this shows great respect for the Tabernacle, (which is empty at the time of Communion, by the way), it is not necessary because you have now just received what the Tabernacle contained – Jesus Himself! As well, a rule for altar servers and lectors is that you don't genuflect when you are carrying something, eg. Cross, book.

Of course, often due to age or disability, people are not able to make a genuflection of the right knee to the floor as they once could. Pope Francis himself is not able to genuflect as he once could and uses a profound bow through all liturgies. The Church clearly instructs that the genuflection in these cases may be replaced by a 'profound bow' which is the head and the torso bent forward at the waist (and not simply the head) toward the Tabernacle. Sometimes people are not able to genuflect but give it a half-effort of bending the knee slightly, though this is not a genuflection and should be replaced with the profound bow. Either way, what is key is that we are using a universal sign of respect for Jesus who is truly present in the Tabernacle. Children need to and should be taught how to genuflect properly and told why we make this common gesture when in the presence of the Tabernacle in the church.

Genuflecting (or a profound bow) is showing respect to the fact that Jesus, who is God and present in this church, is worthy of my love and respect and reverence, shown in the right knee touching the floor. It is a sign of humility before the greatness and presence of God here in this church right before me. It also hearkens to Philippians 2:10-11 that "every knee shall bow in heaven, on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess, that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father".

There is only one time when the Tabernacle is empty and we would not genuflect and that is on Good Friday when there is no Mass and we can see that the Tabernacle is empty because the door is open and there is no lit sanctuary lamp, the reminder that Christ is present in the Tabernacle. In the Good Friday liturgy and up until the Easter Vigil, the Tabernacle remains empty and coming into the church under these conditions requires that we make a profound bow to the altar (not the Tabernacle) which is a symbol of Christ in the Church and which is why the priest kisses the altar when Mass begins and when Mass ends.

Showing respect in the way we arrive and approach the Blessed Sacrament also is a necessary and powerful witness to others that this is not just another building or worship space but is truly the place where God dwells, visibly and physically in the holy house of the churches spread all around the world. We recognize Jesus' Real Presence, by action and awe! (FrC)
