

Conversion is a very serious and life altering thing when you think about it. Becoming a Catholic. It's really not about a quick decision or a change that has ulterior motives, but rather comes from a moved and discerning heart and mind that says, "I *must* look into this Catholic Church thing". It is a pull from above, as is every vocation and summons to follow Jesus, and it is a response also from the Lord Himself that we follow Him as a Catholic.

Conversion to Catholicism comes in many shapes and sizes. For some it is a move from a life without any religious affiliation at all. Others, on the other hand, may have dipped their toes or been born into other Christian denominations over time and have, for some beautiful reason, been attracted to the truth, beauty and goodness of the Catholic faith. Many say that they already knew Jesus but came to recognize the Catholic Church as the fullness of the Truth that is Jesus in the Church Christ Himself founded on Peter, the Rock. They felt drawn, called.

Our parish of St. Mary is blessed with three people who have felt that tug to consider Catholicism and have approached with keen interest not only the idea of conversion but the process by which it is realized – RCIA, *(Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).* It is rightly called a process in that over time and through ongoing discernment, the individual soul learns of Catholic truth in its approach to God's revelation of Himself to mankind through all time. The process of learning goes from general questions to specific ones, like Who Is God? Who Is Jesus? What is the Church? What Is Sin? What Are the Sacraments? Who Is Mary? Who Are the Saints? What is Prayer? What Is the Mass?

Our three RCIA members are **Shelley Mendes**, **Jordan Araujo** and **Evan Euteneier**. Shelley was baptized into a Protestant denomination as a child, married a Catholic and raised their

children in the Catholic faith, and even though she attended Mass here at St. Mary's regularly, had not become a Catholic. I dare say that Shelley was being formed in the pews in the sense that she was, through Mass attendance, exposing herself to mystery and lived Catholic faith, and teaching. When I announced the RCIA process last fall for anyone who might be interested, I specifically tapped her on the should and invited her to consider RCIA, to which she quickly and gladly responded with a 'yes'. As Shelley is already baptized, she is a 'candidate' in the RCIA process.

Jordan is a young man who one Sunday last June appeared at the 9:00 Sunday morning Mass, dressed in a suit and tie.

[I suppose he wasn't aware that Catholics no longer dress up for Mass and that suits were not acceptable. One only need to dress like they were ploughing the back 40 or going to the beach, to worship the Sovereign God of All Things who actually comes to St. Mary's at every single celebration of the Holy Mass.] And Jordan came to Mass every Sunday after that first time in June, wearing that suit. Let me just say, I LOVE THAT SUIT. He came looking for Jesus and got dressed up for it. Beautiful. Jordan had been searching, as do we all, but basically had no religious background to draw from outside of things he had read. He wasn't baptized. But for some reason, he arose one bright and sunny June morning last summer, put on his suit and tie and came to St. Mary's for Mass – his first time in a Catholic church. And I was blessed to have been able to meet him and speak with him afterward which led to talking with him every Sunday and the eventual idea of RCIA. Jordan is a 'catechumen' who is approaching baptism and full initiation in the Church at Easter.

Evan came to Mass (the 9:00 o'clock) one Sunday many months ago. I noticed him because he is fairly tall. After Mass, I was speaking with a few parishioners and saw that he was waiting to speak with me. He told me that this Mass was his first time in a Catholic church and that he had so many questions. I suggested we meet at some point to discuss these, which we did. Evan had been baptized Christian ten years before but was being drawn to Catholicism in reading St. Augustine and others and felt somehow that this was the true Church. He joined RCIA as well and has not missed a single Sunday 9 am Mass. Evan is a 'candidate' in the RCIA process.

These three people, each with their unique and individual journey to a time and place in their lives when they are seriously considering sacramental life in the Roman Catholic Church, are such a blessing to me and to our parish because their journey is my journey, our journey. **Please pray for them** as they approach, with us, the Easter Sacraments of Christ.
