

### THE ECLIPSE: DISTRACTION vs WARNING



This past Monday we had a total solar eclipse which caught the attention of many people of the earth, prompting many to do something they don't often do, both symbolically but also virtually – to look up. We spend much of our lives with our gaze

downward toward the cares and concerns of this life and this world when we need to look up toward the heavens and consider what God sees, wants and is calling us to do. Many Christian believers were discussing what the eclipse might mean in a spiritual sense, and rightly so, as the cosmos that God created from nothing has always specifically called man back to God in the relationship He has always called us to have with Him.

Let's face it, we are people on the earth who have, in so many and increasing ways, thumbed our noses at God. Even if one only has the vaguest of concepts about some mysterious higher power, even to say that He somehow continually watches us, might somehow believe that God could come and destroy or punish us for our neglect of Him. Perhaps for many it is more of a small 'g' god who is out there somewhere, who messes with our lives in mystery; a god to be appeased and kept happy with us so that this god will leave us alone. That kind of god wouldn't, couldn't care about us but instead uses its own power for it's benefit and not ours. This is a god to be avoided and is only seen when a sign in the sky could mean something and suggest of our doom instead of our delight.

I am grateful to have been raised, not with a sense of a god to be appeased but 'the' God of Jesus Christ who loves me, us, the world. He has shown Himself to man after creating everything for him, and even when man rebelled against this good God, He promised us several ways out, creating agreements, covenants with us. We broke them all, but He, who is always faithful to us, created a new covenant and the last covenant there will ever be with man in giving us His Son, Jesus. This final covenant was not made so much in words but through The Word Himself, Jesus, who did the unthinkable: that Jesus, who as God created the cosmos, the mysteries of timelessness, entered into time as His feet walked upon the earth. But why? To, as is so overused a term that it often has no impact – to save us because we, as we were, couldn't possibly save ourselves and so were brought back from the brink by traversing dusty roads with puzzled men whom He lived closely with as He taught, healed, moved hearts, opened minds and ultimately revealed Himself as God in the flesh. He also, in mainly the time space of about 1100 days, did all His teaching, proclamation of the Kingdom, miracles, and Himself showed Himself as the sign that they must look to in order to be saved by that which He was going to save them with in His suffering, barbaric torture, rejection and agonizing death. Why? Because that is what man does, who is under the self-imposed sinfulness and rebellion against God. He is so inclined to kill that which it cannot dominate. And so, we killed God.

We are the same people that want to search out and possibly dream of inhabiting other real estate on hopeful planets that support life. We cannot live on the earth in this restlessness for more so we seek to live somewhere else, a kind of geographical cure to our human, self made woes. As someone once quipped, "How can we live on the moon if we cannot live on the earth?"

God has always willed our good but in our rebellion, we have so often shunned it and we do it still, with ever-increasing force and momentum. The so called 'progress' of man even and especially to this day, seeks to strive after a perfect life by creating a wide variety of death. St. John Paul II called this a culture of death. Our perceived movement forward in our own fake enlightenment seeks not to better our lives in an open response to the so-obvious God, but to all the more reject Him and ultimately, His followers and all those who align themselves with the impact He struck the world with in His first coming. As Fulton Sheen once said, (paraphrased): "We have always lived in sin from the time of Adam and Eve. But what has crept into the world in our modern times is something that is distinct from sin rebellion. Sin is in relationship to our conduct but rebellion is in relationship to authority, even the ultimate of all authority that is God Himself." And this is what is so clearly prevalent in our times and within ourselves. St. Paul himself spoke of this rebellion when he wrote in his Second letter to the Thessalonians (2:3) "And now, brothers, about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and his gathering of us to himself: I beg you, do not suddenly lose your heads or alarm yourselves, whether at some oracular utterance, or pronouncement, or some letter purporting to come from us, alleging that the Day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you in any way whatever. That day cannot come before the final rebellion against God, when wickedness will be revealed in human form, the man doomed to perdition. He is the Enemy. He rises in his pride against every god, so called, every object of men's worship, and even takes his seat in the temple of God claiming to be god himself.

We can see this evident rebellion against God and all He has made and proclaimed to be good – life itself. But our rebellion wars against the life God has given us so that it's our life, not God's and we can do with it or dispose of it at will and as suits us best. We see the ever-increasing death toll in the murder of life at its very beginning in the womb and now in the death at our own hands and will at its end, against nature and God's will and intention. It's interesting and a warning to note that the eclipse of this past week had a trail that crossed an eclipse of 2017 at the very point of a town called Carbondale, Illinois, which just so happens to be the town considered to be the abortion capital of America, opened for its strategic location where surrounding states have stricter abortion laws, enabling, inviting abortions to be had in their town. Coincidence or Godcidence? God has called us to life in Himself and paid the price with His own life to secure it. It matters not what we read in the moon or stars but what we read in His Word and his teaching: that He has come as Saviour and will come again as our judge. Look to Christ. (Fr.C)


