"I See You Home"

Once, a parishioner and friend I know, who had previously spoken about having built his own home, invited me over to see it. When I saw it, my mouth hung open as I hadn't imagined that it would look as both unusual and extraordinary as it appeared in my actual sight of it. It was a home that showed careful planning, simplicity and intention as well as craftsmanship and giftedness. I had pictured a typical house with four walls and a pitched roof. My assumptions before seeing the home were not only wrong but grossly underestimated the work and skill of the man who had built it. After the home visit I no longer saw my friend as living 'somewhere out there' in a home assigned for him by the conjuring of my mind, but truly saw him home in the completed picture of his living there in a house I had seen and he had made.



And that's a great image into the mystery of the eternal and what heaven is like. We have perhaps foggy images and ideas of what we might imagine heaven to look and feel like just as we do of the Builder. And all the while we really only know these things by analogy and some descriptions of them from humans who profess to have seen heaven and the Lord. In all these things we, as St. Paul said, see these things "as through a glass darkly". (1 Cor. 13:12)

For now we see in a mirror darkly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I have been fully known.

Over the years I have experienced the deaths of so many people; classmates when I was in school, grandparents, parents, relatives, friends and many parishioners. We can never know with certainty who or how many made it to heaven with Jesus which is why it is not only good but crucial that we remember to pray for them. While they can pray for us, they cannot pray for themselves — they need us. My father died in 2014 and my mother in 2020. I pray for them at every Sunday Mass and doing so brings me to "see them home" with Jesus. Do I know this with certainty? No. But with my fond remembrances of their faithfulness to and love of the Lord, I see them home. I picture

them with Jesus whom they had known in this life and longed to see at the end of their lives. As I knew them, I know the Lord and can therefore hope with some degree of certainty that Christ's great mercy and His ability to have always seen them come together in that place and with those Persons of the Blessed Trinity who are Love itself. I never have considered for a moment that the parents I knew and loved and who loved me, are six feet under the earth in a vault and coffin as they horizontally wait with eyes closed for the Resurrection. They are not there at all. The soul brings life to the body so that when the body dies the soul can not remain in the body. Therefore, the great spiritual work that we do as the Church is commend that soul to Jesus – send them home. They are now outside of time and space and, therefore, for all intents and purposes, are not here. I pray that they are with the Lord as I will continue to do.

What heaven is really like will remain for the living on the earth a mystery as even those who claim to have had a near death experience of things 'on the other side' so often say that the colours and appearance of what their eyes beheld were nothing like we know here on earth and were flummoxed as how to use our earthly language and words to describe it. That is why the Gospels always show us Jesus who describes the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of Heaven with analogies... "The Kingdom of Heaven is like...". I am reminded of the words to a song I learned when I was a boy, that

"Man is lonely by birth; man is only a pilgrim on earth.

Born to be king is but a temporary thing,
only a loan while on earth."

This life is loaned and entrusted to us to be spent in coming to know Jesus and living with Him now in preparation of doing so forever. Ours is a human journey in time with and toward the God of Jesus Christ who exists outside of it, yet was born into time and space in the incarnation and His short earthly life.

This Trinity Sunday encompasses in its title the very fact that it is pure mystery. How can one be three and three be one? And here, even analogies all fall so pathetically short for the more we say about it the greater the mystery remains. Suffice it to say that it is known to us because it has been revealed by God to man. This is why we profess it in the creeds of the Church because it is essential and revealed but still a mystery. And in God, the only thing one can do when confronted with such enormous mystery is to walk into the mystery, because the mystery is God. It is not a mystery to be solved or figured out by humans - and no one has laid claim to being able to do so. The Trinity is a living, loving eternal relationship of being itself revealed as a mystery of Persons; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And yet, against all human logic and reason, this Trinity of Love desires to draw near to us and us to them in a relationship that God wants never to end. And as great and unfathomable this love of God for us, for you, is, we have the God-given ability of free choice to say 'no' to the most incredible and enduring and trusted love of all. As people of faith who live in this fleeting, temporary world of time, our response must be an everymoment, every day 'yes' to God and the desire to see not only ourselves but everyone "Home". (Fr. 
