

THE FOUR LAST THINGS

In this month of November, with its return to more bleak skies, cooler temperatures and the inevitable coming of winter, the Church reflects this mood of nature in the monthly remembrance of all of the souls who have been commended to God after bodily death; and this of all people in every age and time. This topic of death which has and will meet every soul that has ever lived - save that of Our Blessed Lady – is a good opportunity for us to look at what the Church calls The Four Last Things (which doesn't include taxes), namely, Judgement, Heaven and Hell. The first two of these come to every soul in that everyone dies and everyone will face the judgment of God, both personal and general.

DEATH

Death is the result of Original Sin committed by Adam and Eve. Had they not sinned, death would not await us all and we would all live. Even though Christ came to die so that we might live, death is still a consequence of sin, both original and our actual sins. We are mortal but our souls are immortal. As Catholics we contemplate the reality of death and our own personal death with a sense of urgency in that we should live our lives knowing that we won't be here for very long and what is imperative is what the old Baltimore Catechism taught, that "God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him forever in Heaven". It's not about our human, earthly endeavors alone so much as it is our relationship with the One who made us, our adherence in serving Him in this life and the fullness of heaven when we die. Death is the separation of the soul from the body. The judgment of God is given to everyone which basically is boiled down to love God and neighbour.

JUDGMENT

There are two judgments: the first at the moment of our own, personal death (Particular Judgment) and a second at the General Judgment of all people at the end of time. There is no reincarnation in coming back and reliving our earthly in a different body or as a different thing. The scripture is clear on this - "it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement." (Hebrews 9:27) So, then, judgment by God takes place the moment we die and then is followed by a judgment of all peoples in every time at the end of all things. We take heart in that Christ is a just judge and cannot be wrong about us for He knows us and His judgments are fair and true. As much as I may fear God, the sinner that I am, I want God to be my judge for His judgment is also merciful and He is the One who loves me in who I am and He created me. Our judgment also has to be seen through the reality of Jesus' Cross on Calvary where He died so that we would not die in our sin but live forever with Him. Judgment is based on our every-day choice of renewing our life with Jesus, with the great aid and help

of the Holy Spirit given to us in baptism, the sacraments, prayer and the Eucharist.

HEAVEN

Heaven awaits those who, after their earthly life is folded up, are pure enough to go directly into heaven and live in the bliss and blessing of all that the scriptures have said and revealed to us. Heaven is seeing (for the first time) God as He is which is beyond any human description. The moment you think you can say what heaven is, it's not heaven. It is so beyond our human capabilities to perceive that which no eye has seen, ear heard or mind thought. It is the fulfillment of every human heart that has sought after God in this life. Yet it is not enough that we would mechanically follow Him in this life for Jesus told the parable about those 'invited' to the wedding banquet, who politely said they had other plans and concerns, and who ended up not in the wedding banquet. Meanwhile others we might consider 'less' than us spiritually get in. This is to say that we shouldn't take heaven for granted but actively live and work for the eternal life God has invited us to have. purgatory isn't mentioned in the four last things, that's because it is only temporary and is for those who still need purification before admittance into heaven. don't, however, want to aim for purgatory because our immortal soul cannot afford to miss the goal of heaven if we should miss purgatory. We must pray for souls who are there and they can pray for us, though not for themselves.

HELL

Hell is real. The Baltimore Catechism states that "Hell is a state to which the wicked are condemned, and in which they are deprived of the sight of God for all eternity, and are in dreadful torments." (BC, No. 417) When we contemplate the reality of hell, the forever absence of God, then we see hell as our own torment for our choice and choices in this life. Every day living for Christ, loving God and loving our neighbour is the daily habit of walking toward the goal of eternal life with Jesus. Prayer both communal (Church) and personal deepens our relationship with Christ and empowers us to live more freely for Jesus and with Jesus. But if our following starts to slightly deviate from that following each day, the gap between the path of Christ and our own begins to widen as our time on earth passes. To follow Christ is to renew that following every single day and to look at how we love Him, our neighbour and ourselves. The reality of hell has to be seen bluntly in that the Devil wants us dead. He is a liar who will tell us that we're doing okay in the life we are living and that God understands that we have certain desires and drives inclinations to sin.

It may seem a bit unnerving that the place and the Person with whom we shall live for all eternity, is based on our personal Yes or No. We choose. Choose Christ.


