

And now, for something totally different...

For a couple of decades now I've been writing articles in parish bulletins. The idea was to further the work of the homily beyond the Sunday Mass to look at the various dimensions of Catholic faith, the scriptures, the holy saints and martyrs and to address the many issues in our time that the Gospel so clearly addresses. I have written on so many other and varied topics we all either puzzle over or contemplate as part of the cross and mystery of life as a human on the earth for a time.

In many ways writing has been cathartic in that I was able to work out by writing down my reflections on such topics as the dying and death of my parents, the loss of dogs I've had over the years and the impact their going leaves on my heart. I know this relates to so many people who have lost close loved ones - a spouse, a parent, a child, a baby, a miscarriage, and yes, even the loss of a beloved dog or pet.

Over the years I've had six dogs of whom all but one were rescues. My first dog, Buddy, was a Collie Shepherd mix and he was so smart and loveable and served as a great companion to me for 11 years when I was first assigned to a parish on my own in Port My second dog, Bear, was what was believed to be a Wolfhound-Shepherd cross. He was such a gentle giant weighing almost 150 pounds, though most of his weight had to have been from his big heart because he was just so gentle and friendly with everyone. He died at the age of seven from Lymphoma. Jigs was a shepherd-beagle cross and a shyer dog than the others. He was such a sweetie and always stuck close to me while getting along so well with my other dog. Sadly, Jigs developed cancer and passed away at the age of seven, far too early for his going and for me. I adopted Red from a rescue that obtains dogs from Ohio. Red was abandoned as a 3year-old in a shopping centre parking lot in Ohio, was bit by other dogs and was so frightened and scared when I first met him. He adopted me and lived quite happily for sixteen years before he had a stroke here in Collingwood and died a few days later.

My two current dogs are Teddy, who is soon to be tenyears-old and appears to be a Scottish Deer Hound while Finnigan, a Shepherd-Beagle cross, who just turned seven last month, is not only smart but full of beans and a bit of a baby. He still often reminds me of a pup with his alert gaze and erect ears when he spots something of interest.

So, this brings me to something totally different.

As a priest who has had dogs and loved them for the past 27-years, I must confess that I've not had much time away from the parishes I've been assigned to due to my dogs. Many people don't want dogs as guests which has made my chances to get away for a day or two on my day off pretty slim to nil. The only times I've been away even since I've come here to St. Mary's in Collingwood, has been twice a year for the annual Priests' retreat and the Priests' seminar, each lasting for four days and three nights. While attending these gatherings of priests I've paid people who have boarded my dogs in their homes, and it gets quite expensive to do this. Getting away for an overnight stay with a sibling or visiting a friend is not only a nice idea but is a real break from living in the rectory 24/7 and always being on call. As the old saying goes, a change is as good as a rest.

Now to my point. I thought I would put it out there that if there were any dog-loving parishioners who have had experience with dogs and love them, might be interested in caring for my dogs the odd time when I could get away, that would be great and so appreciated.

Both Teddy and Finn get along like brothers and are gentle and obedient. Teddy is calmer and more relaxed while Finn is always in the mood to play.

They are good on walks, though they don't always like the appearance of other dogs on the street and will call on them with a bark or two. They are not car-smart so couldn't be off-leash. A fenced-in backyard would be needed as they are used to running around a bit and playing with each other each day. Like so many dogs, they are up when you are and chill when you want to relax and have some quiet. Even without walks for a day or two, they would be fine just to run around the backyard or have Finn chase a ball. Please let me know if dog-sitting now and then would be of interest to you and a big help to me. Call Jayne at the parish.


