

Dedication could be defined as being driven to serve through great love. To say that 93-year-old Ted Van Boxmeer has been dedicated in his more than 60- years of service to St. Mary's parish would be an understatement. In the last few months, Ted has stepped away from the various chores and varied ministries he has done for this parish community, a much-deserved respit from his six decades long active involvement in service to the Lord. We are the beneficiaries of Ted's quiet, constant work for the good and the life of St. Mary's Parish, Collingwood. And



much of that work was done behind the scenes and unseen, but known and seen by God. His late wife, Anne, was also greatly involved in the life of St. Mary's and served as CWL president as well, and both Ted and Anne, along with Dick and Elinore Vandervechte, donated the crucifix which hangs on the sanctuary wall.

Over the span of six decades, Ted was an altar server, a sacristan and an usher but he also assisted with weddings, funerals and baptisms. Each year Ted and his wife would set up the church for Thanksgiving and he always made sure that Mass preparations were in order and properly set up for any visiting priest. As a trusted man who could be counted on, he opened and unlocked the church each day, also replenishing the altar and votive candle supply and collected the money and rolled the coins himself. He also served as parish gardener in cutting the grass, caring for the gardens and shoveling the winter snow. He often used to sleep in the church basement many years ago, with its dirt floor, in order to ensure that the faulty old furnace didn't go out in the night, ensuring parishioners a warm place of worship the next day. And it was a warm heart for God and others that spurned Ted on to this kind of life in service at St. Mary's Parish. WAITING

What a blessed people we are when in the wisdom of the Church we are given repeated annual opportunities to realign

our Christian walk with Christ more closely to Him and if we have been following the Lord far-off, as St. Peter himself had once done, we are given marvellous graces from the Lord in seasons of the Church that call us back to Him.

Our 'waiting' in the Advent season consisting of just four quick Sundays, is not a passive waiting, as for a bus or a phone call, but one that calls us to awaken or reawaken to the truth that Christ is coming at a time we do not know and cannot know. We make preparations within our souls asking ourselves where we presently are standing in relationship to Christ and whether we actually want to, desire to see Him and be with Him forever. The desire to be with the Lord, while it could be from a sense of weariness of this world or a sense of escape from it (as with M.A.I.D.) we don't and can't choose when we will meet Christ. He chooses because our lives belong to Him.

The four Sundays represent a season of joy. This is not a penitential season with an emphasis on sin and repentance and Advent is not just a mini-Lent of fewer weeks where we basically are called to do the same things. No, Advent is a joyful waiting, a time to get ready on the inside while all around us a tinsel Christmas is already being celebrated. I've always held that the Advent we enter into will determine the Christmas we celebrate. If the four weeks leading up to Christmas are observed purely in a secular way, we will no doubt have a secular Christmas and will be so sick and tired of it come December 26 that we'll wonder how we got caught up in it all once again. But, the best things in life are free and our parish celebrations of Advent will put us in the mood to want to get our lives in spiritual order, enter into reflection in the mystery and joy of what Christ has done for us and wants to give to us still.

The First Sunday of Advent, and through the readings on each of the Sunday's, tells of hope, the Second Sunday, of faith, the Third, love and the Fourth, peace and these four convey all that is needed and necessary in the spiritual life in anticipation of the great things God has promised us.

A principal in life which works to give us a better perspective on any season of preparation is, First the famine, then the Feast. In some sense we tend to want to simply enjoy this time of glitsy Christmas decorations, music, lights and a sentimental sense of Christmas' past in our lives. We might even be tempted to think that this time, somewhere from mid-November and Santa Claus parades, is what we are celebrating, but it can't be. Realistically, though, we get tired of this so quickly and by the time Christmas rolls around we can't wait to take down the tree, decorations and any semblance of Christmas and be rid of it, wondering how we thought it was so great in the first place. That's because Christmas without Christ can't deliver Christmas in what it truly means.

So, waiting, the last thing we might think of doing during this hectic, busy and party time before Christmas, is the thing our souls need most because the waiting soul will, yes will, know hope, faith, love and peace... in Jesus, because He alone is the reason for the season. *(Fr. Charles)*


MISSALS

The future of giving is coming to St. Mary's Parish. In the next few weeks, we will be installing a Tip Tap pay machine in the front vestibule of the parish. There will be a device that will allow you to tap \$5.00, \$10.00 or \$20.00.

You will also have the option to register your card after your first TAP, if you wish to receive a tax receipt, (you only need to register your card one time).

Each 'tiptap" gift that you make with a registered card will be available for an end of year tax receipt. There is no data stored in the 'tiptap' device; it also cannot be hacked as any tampering triggers a signal that shuts down the device.
