



Faithful Navigator: Domenic Sanfilippo 705-445 7615 Last week, after I had been selected for jury duty, and while the trial I was on only took four days, I lost my day off and most of the remainder of the week. And, it just so happened that we had bad weather with drifting and blowing snow which made for poor visibility with hazardous road conditions. At times, when the drifts of snow along the roads were picked up by the gusting winds, I suddenly couldn't see a thing in front of me and, slowing down to a crawl, I prayed that no one was headed toward me or in my lane. Talk about white-knuckle driving! I took a picture while driving through one of the white-outs (see below) and you can well imagine how I couldn't see a thing.



No matter whether global warming has been renamed climate change, we haven't seen a winter of cold and snow like this for quite a few years, and it reminds me of the snow-piled winters when I was a child and the drifts and the piles of shovelled snow were way over

my head, (though admittedly I was somewhat shorter back then and everything was much bigger to me than now).

This has been a hard winter and I can scarcely believe that I was swimming off the pier here in Collingwood on September 29th last summer! On that day the water was still fairly warm as was the air on that sunny day with its gentle breeze. I remember that it was warm enough that I didn't need a towel each time I came out of the water for the sun itself dried me off. But December saw the snow start coming and looking back now it would almost seem that we haven't had a reprieve since then. Over the past few weeks, we have seen snow almost every day, and often quite a bit of it. And while the ever-busy snow ploughs have seen little rest along with their drivers, and the many towns people who had the luxury of a snow blower or the curse of a small snow shovel, everyone has been digging out trying to stay ahead of the accumulation. Our back parking lot behind the church has a mountain of snow and the contractors who plow it have no where else to put it except to pile it up. As you approach various intersections in town, the snow is so high that it is wise to slowly enter these crossroads inching slowly lest someone come barreling along and hit you.

In Job 38:22, among the many impossible questions God asks of Job, He says, "Have you entered the storehouses of the snow or seen the storehouses of the hail?" I knew it. That's where all the snow is coming from — a storehouse! I wish they'd close it down, already! But seriously, snow in the scriptures (this image well described for those of us who see it every year), refers to what God wants to do in our souls, to make them white and clean. And the beautiful image from Isaiah 1:18, where God says to us poor sinners, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though

they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool." The one advantage of this winter over many others before is that the snow has stayed and with each new blanket of snow, it has remained so dazzling white. Again, this is a beautiful metaphor for what scripture refers to as God's cleansing us of our sins. In Matthew 28:3, we hear of the angel of the Lord who comes down and rolls the stone away from the tomb Jesus had been laid in. The Gospel writer's description of the angel is such that, "His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow". It's interesting to note that while the Holy Land, with its heat and more arid ground, rarely gets snow, yet is often enough used as a symbol for purity and the wondrous work of God's grace in our life that restores, cleans and makes new – white as snow.

Just after last weekend, we celebrated Canada's Family Day on Monday. The idea of this holiday long-weekend was partly initiated to give a bit of a break to the many who find this time of year, particularly February, depressing. Often enough we are hemmed in on every side by gray skies, sloppy streets, short days and longer nights, accompanied by snow and cold temperatures, which many find to be depressing and dark. Nature can and does sometimes share our mood. We didn't even get the break of a January thaw this year and 'Wiarton Willie' likely won't be popping his head out until some time in June when the last of the winter snow finally disappears. Ugh.




You have an option of \$10.00, \$20.00 or \$50.00.


