

# PONDERANCES

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others. "We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." (Rm 14:7-8) I never thought much about Sister Mary Jacqueline, a Sister in the Grey nuns who was my Grade 1 teacher in Saint John the Evangelist elementary school when I was a child. But since my ordination in 1993, I have so often not only sighted her example and influence on my life in my formative years but have often told others in various congregations of the parishes where I have served, about that influence. Her life influenced mine in ways that I could never have imagined and I'm sure she never thought possible at the time. One of my early passions was my dislike for school. I was easily distracted from classroom lessons to road construction taking place outside on the street. It wasn't that I was lazy or not bright, but rather was attracted to activity and building and what I would now consider the more practical things in life and not the rather sedentary life of a young boy student. I also was aware in my early youth of the realness and closeness of God. He was real and alive to me even more than the construction outside or the desk I was sitting at and even the ideas and concepts I was being taught. I knew Jesus and felt His warm and constant close presence. In so many ways I think about Sr. Mary Jaqueline's part in the influence she had on me as she would truly (long before it became the right thing to put on a pastoral reference application) integrate the beautiful truths of Catholic faith into every part of classroom life. When the class was doing art, Sister would put on records of songs that expounded the faith covering the Ten Commandments, the Mass, and the teachings of the Church. To this day I remember the Ten Commandments by heart in song from one of the records:

First, I must honour God,
Second, honour His name;
Third, honour His Day, keep it holy, this will be my aim.
Fourth, I must be obedient,
Fifth, be kind and true,
Sixth be pure in all I say, and see and hear and do;
Seventh, I must be honest,
Eighth be truthful in all things I say;
Ninth, be pure in mind and heart and all I think and desire each day;
Tenth, I must be satisfied, not be jealous come what may.

The fleeting of time in one's life is most acknowledged by those who find themselves suddenly older and I've been afforded a keen sense of this and the knowledge that so many from among those I had known and had grown up with are already 'gone'. I would hope and pray that others in their lives had an influence on them, most especially to hope for heaven and come to know the God of Jesus Christ, Love Itself enfleshed. As the saying goes: "If you meet me and you forget me, you have lost nothing. If you meet Christ and forget Him, you have lost everything!"

These are God's Ten Commandments – these I must obey.

I wrote the following poem called *Fleeting* in January of 2020. It speaks of the glories of God glimpsed but so briefly in the moments of this life.

#### **FLEETING**

When in the moments of life's natural slumbers we experience and taste the beauteous bliss of something truly wonderful. Upon a slow but startled waking—we in that moment long to be back in that sleeping reality of dreams.

Could this not be but a so-brief ember of the great Eternal Fire/Flame?

As a person, a Pilgrim and a priest, I know that my life has had an influence on others, (and some of it has been good! :) The privilege to preach, teach and sanctify, part of the ordination mandate by the call of God through the Church, demands that I respond to the Spirits' movement by lighting fires in the hearts of those who see and hear me, the souls I am privileged and called to shepherd. Self-reflection, a good and necessary thing in the spiritual life, is the stuff of knowing who I am and have been in the light of God.

## AND WONDER WHO I WAS

Though I lie here beneath the sod, My body dead, my soul with God, my headstone stands for all that's left, that some passing, ambling guest should light upon its words of rest – and wonder who I was.


