

PASTORAL LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP CARDINAL FRANK LEO REGARDING BILL C-9



5 December 2025

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I write to you today to convey my support of the 4 December letter to Prime Minister Carney issued by the Permanent Council of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) concerning proposed amendments to Bill C-9 and the possible removal of the long-standing "good faith" religious-text defence in the Criminal Code.

As Catholics, we must always firmly reject all forms of hatred and discrimination, and we stand in solidarity with those who suffer from violence, intimidation, or prejudice. Our faith calls us to uphold the dignity of every human person and to contribute to a society marked by justice, peace, and respect for all.

At the same time, the concerns highlighted by the CCCB deserve serious attention. The ability to express and teach our faith freely—without fear that sincere, good-faith proclamation of the Gospel might be misunderstood as unlawful—is a cornerstone of a healthy, democratic Canada. Removing this narrow but important safeguard risks creating uncertainty for clergy, educators, and all people of faith who seek to pass on the teachings of the Church with charity and integrity.

I encourage you to read the CCCB Permanent Council's letter in full and to stay informed about the discussions surrounding Bill C-9. I also ask that you join me in praying that our elected officials will work collaboratively with religious communities and legal experts to ensure that efforts to curb hatred do not unintentionally undermine the constitutional freedoms that allow people of all faiths to flourish in our country.

I am sharing this letter and the communication from the Permanent Council of the CCCB with every elected Member of Parliament in the Archdiocese of Toronto so that they are aware of our deep concerns. Let us continue to witness to Christ with confidence, compassion, and truth, trusting always in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Be assured of my continued gratitude and ongoing prayers for you and your loved ones.

GOD SPEECH vs. HATE SPEECH

This letter from our Cardinal Archbishop, Frank Leo, serves as a written endorsement of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' letter sent to Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney and many other Members of Parliament. It explicitly addresses our 225 parishes in the Archdiocese of Toronto, expressing serious concern about the 'interpretation' of the Gospel message of Jesus Christ and how some may perceive the Church's teachings on sin as 'hate'. That is why debates on television often revolve around hate speech, where one group labels something as hate speech, and the opponent rightly asks, "define hate speech", "what do you mean by hate speech?" Almost always, they cannot and do not provide an answer. And therein lies the problem. When legislators seek to introduce hate speech laws, which can and will bring charges against those accused of it, it is rarely clear what specifically constitutes so-called hate speech. This often allows anyone who is offended by something to call it hate speech carelessly.

As Christians, Catholics hold clear, unchangeable teachings that apply to every age without exception. For example, if someone who was validly married leaves their spouse and lives with someone else as a couple, it is called adultery. Yet, someone could and would hear preaching in church that condemns adultery, be offended by it, and consider it hate speech. And because an individual deems it as such, they could, under hate speech laws, bring charges against a preacher, minister, rabbi or priest for what they consider as hate speech.

At present, churches, synagogues, and mosques are at risk of having their preachers charged, incurring significant legal costs in their own defence, and facing possible jail time for what they have said in their preaching. Granted, if something were said that was blatantly inciting hate and violence toward individuals or groups, this would be wrong. But today, much of the Gospel of life that Jesus preached and the Church teaches may be perceived as hate by those who will not hear or tolerate the accepted truth that has been held as such for centuries, if not millennia. And this would not only apply to those things said publicly, but also to what is spoken within the walls of a religious edifice. In other words, words some people don't like could be used by them to bring public, legal charges against the people or institutions that spoke them. The faith that has always been proclaimed by the Catholic Church in many cases today has been cited as hate speech, though no violence is called for, nor hatred evident. Yet if one personally is offended or perceives personal emotional harm, they can freely consider it hate speech. And if legislation is passed, such as the Canadian Bishops and our Cardinal have pointed out in Bill C-9, then effectively censorship can be imposed not only on the preachers of the Gospel of Christ, but can be done so under the auspices of so-called hate speech. It is very dangerous to create and enforce laws that can directly impinge on the religious freedom we have always enjoyed and have a right and a duty before God to uphold. In a culture where saying abortion is murder is often considered hate speech by some, we need the protection of freedom of speech to be able to continue to say it is and to call our culture out on this sin and all sin that grieves the heart of God and is contrary to the Lord who is life itself. 


