

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



THE WORD "AMEN"

I remember asking children in the elementary grades of school, and some even older, what they thought the word "Amen" means. I heard that it meant the equivalent of saying, 'the end' at the conclusion of a prayer or that it told God you were finished after speaking to him. And, of course, it is none of these things though the word does appear at the end of prayers and is our only response at Communion when the priests says, "The Body of Christ". Children learn, as do all of us, that the word "Amen" is an assertion of faith and is tantamount to saying, "I believe" or "I agree".

During the celebration of the Mass the 'Amen' response is found from beginning to end and we usually end all our personal prayers with this affirmation of faith, with our "I believe".

The etymology of the word is interesting in that in the original Aramaic, the language Jesus himself spoke, and as it was hard to translate directly, the translation from other languages was used. Among the definitions it means to give assent to, to uphold, support or agree-with. So, given that this often-used word in the prayers of the Church appears at the end of every prayer, what is its importance and significance for each of us personally? It is our personal "yes" to the things of God – our prayer, our blessings and our acknowledgement that all that is proclaimed by the Church in her timeless teachings ultimately calls for our own individual assent of mind and heart.

In the Mass itself, following the Eucharistic Prayer and before we pray the *Our Father*, we respond to the whole Eucharistic Prayer with what is called the *Great Amen*. Now often enough it doesn't sound so great, especially during this pandemic when our singing voices have been muffled by a physical appendage over our mouths and the restriction from singing that has been added to our many modifications and removals from parish life. When the Amen is said, it sounds rather flat and quiet compared to a rousing sung Amen.

Most important in our use of the response, Amen, during



the Mass is when we say it just before we receive the Eucharist. We don't just say Thank You or Praise the Lord! or God is good! but simply and audibly say Amen!

The Church teaches, (and this is so important), that when we say "Amen" before we receive the Sacred Host, we are

also saying "Amen" to everything the Church teaches and believes — everything. Why is this so? Because the Eucharist is the "Source and Summit" of our Catholic faith and lives.

I once heard a Catholic priest give a talk on the Eucharist where he said that a non-Catholic asked him why he couldn't receive Communion in the Catholic Church since he personally believed that it was Jesus? The priest responded by saying that the non-Catholic may in fact believe that the Eucharist is the Body of Christ but he is not in agreement with the body of Christ that is the Church.

"Otherwise, if you say a blessing with the spirit, how can anyone in the position of an outsider say the "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since the outsider does not know what you

are saying?"

We see this truth in 1 Corinthians 14:16:

St. Augustine said, in speaking about the Eucharist, "Say 'Amen' to what you are. We receive the Body of Christ in order to become the Body of Christ, the Church". And every couple that gets married in the Church adds the "Amen" to the vows they say in the name of the Most Blessed Trinity, which is to say that they give assent with their all to the promises they have just made to each other for life.

Once again, this truth for all Catholics should be a focus of our own moral compass particularly when we are tempted to be quick to reject certain teachings of the Church because we have been lured into believing the latest teachings of the world, and they are legion.

Saying 'yes' to the revelation and the mystery of God is an assent of faith that even while we may not or cannot fully understand what God has given to us and has been passed on to us by the Church, we can and must say 'yes' to it because God is God and we are not God.

Yet it is not only in the liturgy of the Church and the Mass where we find the meaning of "Amen", but in those things that come to all of us in one way or another and challenge us greatly in life. An illness, a sick child, the loss of a job or a relationship, the state of a rapidly changing and declining world — all these and many other things present a real challenge to us and our faith as well. In time and with God's grace we can say "yes" to His will, even and especially when we don't understand or like it.

The pivotal moment in a Christian's life is when we move from knowing God (or about God) in our head alone and come to know Him in our heart, mind, body and very soul. It is when we come to know that He is real, alive and with us and this truth makes us able to say "Amen" to His plan for our life. And, of course, this is easier said than done in that it requires trust in the One we say "Amen" to. And this is done by practice – the practice of faith. (Fr. Charles)
