

## JUNE 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 **TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**



Life is like a boat, exposed to a myriad of dangers; temptations, occasions to sin, bad counsels of men, passions of corrupt nature, etc. Never lose confidence when temptations arise, keep your eyes on God, who alone can deliver us.

When you have to listen to abuse, that means you are being buffeted by the wind. When your anger is roused, you are being tossed by the waves. So when the winds blow and the waves mount high, the boat is in danger, your heart is imperilled, your heart is taking a battering. On hearing yourself insulted, you long to retaliate; but the joy of revenge brings with it another kind of misfortune shipwreck. Why this? Because Christ is asleep in you. What do I mean? I mean you have forgotten His presence. Rouse Him, then; remember Him, let Him keep watch within you, pay heed to Him. A temptation arises: it is the wind. It disturbs you: it is the surging of the sea. This is the moment to awaken Christ and let Him remind you of those words: 'Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?

Catholics throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto are encouraged to read Cardinal Collins' latest Pastoral Letter, "Heart Speaks to Heart", a deep reflection on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is observed in 2021 on Friday, June 11 and you are encouraged to offer a special focus on the Sacred Heart in the month of June. The theme of the Sacred Heart, however, is pertinent throughout the year and the resources, prayers and reflections are helpful tools to utilize year round.

#### The Nativity of St. John the Baptist, June 24

John the Baptist, (between 8 & 4 BCE – about CE 27), according to all four Gospels the precursor of Jesus Christ, was born in Judaea, the son of the priest Zacharias and Elizabeth, cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus. John



was a Nazarite from birth and prepared for his mission by year of self-discipline in the desert. At about the age of 30 he went into the country around the River Jordan preaching penance to prepare for the imminent coming of the Messiah. He baptized penitents with water as a symbol of baptism of the Holy Spirit that was to come. With the baptism of Jesus, his office as precursor was accomplished, and his ministry came to a close soon afterwards. John angered Herod Antipas, the Judaean ruler, by denouncing him for marrying Herodias, the wife of his half-brother Herod, and was imprisoned (see Luke 3:1-20). At the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias and Herod, John was beheaded (see Matthew 14:3-11). In art, John the Baptist is represented as wearing a garment made of hair and often carries a staff and a scroll with the words "Ecce Agnus Dei", or "Behold the Lamb of God", a reference to John 1:29.
