

The Year of Saint Joseph Concludes

Last year, on December 8, 2020, the Holy Father declared the beginning of the Year of St. Joseph. The Church calls all of her children to devote a year of their thoughts and directed prayer to a particular saint or Person of the Holy Trinity so that we might all the more grow in our knowledge and appreciation of that person or reality. This past year of St. Joseph, which culminates on Wednesday, December 8, has been at a time of pandemic which could rightly be called a pandemic of fear while St. Joseph stands as a guiet but powerful image of strength, peace and abiding trust in God. We will also be fresh into a new year of the Church. Year C, in the Ecclesiastical calendar which indicates looking at the life of Jesus and the whole of the truth of the scriptures filled with promise, hope and the revelation of Christ through largely through the eyes and writing of St. Luke. Yet all of the Gospels find St. Joseph absolutely silent in speech for he never utters a word but his life is a bright and vivid life is one of witness and guidance for a weary world in need of salvation. St. Joseph was the great protector of both Mary and the child Jesus.

St. Joseph is the patron Saint of the Universal Church and the patron Saint of Canada. He stands quietly but attentively guarding the Church in intercession, help and steadfast love, as he did for Mary and Jesus. We can and should turn to him in prayer asking him to intercede for us in our need of help and protection in the midst of a world that more and more seems godless and lost in its own pursuits, not relying on the Divine plan for our lives but trusting instead in ourselves and our own minds that are not formed and focused on the things of God and the Kingdom of Christ. Let us resolve to turn to St. Joseph in these last moments of the holy year dedicated to him as he is to us. (Fr. C)

This month of November is a time when we turn our prayerful attention to intercession on behalf of all of the souls who have experienced bodily death and rely on us, the Church on earth, to pray and intercede on their behalf before God. Yet we need to continue beyond November to do so. I have often spoken about the sad truth that more and more Catholics are not having their deceased loved ones commended to God when in replacement they have opted for the worldly version called a 'Celebration of Life'. While all remembrance can bring reflection on those who are now deceased, it is much more important that we remember them in the face of God then merely on a human level. More crucially, though, is the reality that if we celebrate a person's time of living on this earth alone, separated from who they are at their core – a spiritual being – then the greatest and enduring dimension, the eternal, is missing and lost. And if we scarcely think that they somehow 'live on' or worse, if we simply assume that they are now in 'heaven', we won't do that which is our prayerful work here on earth and that is, to pray for them. If I see someone who has died as simply in heaven, then why would I pray for them? Why would I remember them in my words of supplication to God's ears that He have mercy on them, forgive their sins and bring them into heaven to live with Him? Obviously, those who are in heaven do not need our prayers at all – they've made it to the throne of God and behold His face forever. Or do they? We don't know and cannot know for sure. And so, we pray for them, hold them up to God in asking God to receive their soul that He would be merciful in His perfect, flawless judgment of them for He is God, and that He would allow them to be purified by the fire of His love in their time of waiting and aided by our prayers for them as well. We are meant to be participants in the things of heaven in regard to the souls that live forever and we desire that they see and be with God. Yet, if I canonize someone who has died with no thought of their need for my prayers, God's mercy, or His forgiveness, then I won't believe them to be in need of anything and, therefore, I won't pray for them. They will merely be a 'memory' to us and not a soul in need of God's help and mine, for what it's worth. So, in remembering those you have known who have died, pray for them. (Fr. C)
