

Well, we're back in the printing of our parish bulletin, but not for long in this present format. Soon we will be switching to another process whereby the bulletin will be

published by an outside company, which will alleviate the need for us to have the covers printed, and the bulletin copies duplicated on our parish photocopier. We will simply put the bulletin material together and then electronically send it to the printer who, in turn, will copy all four sides of it (front and back) and will then ship it to us prior to the weekend, all printed and folded and ready to be placed in the church.

We will still rely on our kind sponsors who have so generously covered the cost of the printing in the past, enabling St. Mary's to basically have a bulletin that is cost-free to the parish and much less work for the parish secretary. The printer will even print four extra bulletin inserts per year free of charge and insert them into our bulletin for us.

ALL MANDATORY COVID MEASURES **NO LONGER IN FORCE IN PARISHES**

We received an update from the Cardinal's Office this week, in line with the



anticipated announcement from the government, that all Covid restrictions and measures are no longer in use in all areas of the parish. In some ways this is not news to us as most of the protocols were removed back in March when the six-foot distancing, the mandatory masking, hand sanitizing and other rules that impacted liturgy were lifted. This returned us to the use of all our pews instead of every second one and many other former ways of doing things. Parishioners are still free to use facemasks if they wish but it is purely an option. Who would have thought that 2 ½ years ago when we were initially told that we would be closing the churches for two weeks to "flatten the curve" that all this time later we would now be officially retracting all covid measures? As always, it should be the right of any individual to choose to do what they are comfortable with and if they feel safer with a mask on, they are free to do so.

COMMUNION and the LIFTING OF PROTOCOLS

While the previous protocols in force for much of the past two plus years are gone, and have been since March of this year, this is a good time to remember the instructions given to us by the Catholic Bishops in Canada when the new Roman Missal came out around 2011.

Covid protocols changed those instructions and many of us have likely forgotten our original guidelines on how to come forward and receive Holy Communion at Mass. Actually, they are quite simple and straightforward.



- 1. As soon as the person in front of you for Communion, receives and steps aside or walks away, you bow.
- 2. Then place your hands out to receive Communion, the hand you eat and write with placed underneath the opposite hand OR you stand or kneel to receive Communion.
- 3. The priest will say, "The Body of Christ" and the communicant answers, "Amen".
- 4. The priest will place the Sacred Host in your hand or on your tongue.

There is no need to genuflect to the Tabernacle right after you have received Holy Communion, as you are now a walking, breathing tabernacle as you have just received into your body the Body of Jesus.

TRADES HELPING ST. MARY'S

We all know just how expensive it is to call a plumber or an electrician to get something repaired or replaced, even on smaller items. So often in a parish, many skilled workers and tradesman are parishioners but it isn't known to the pastor. If you have a trade or expertise and would be willing to let me know, it would be beneficial to me and the parish in case there is something that needs to be done and you are able to help. Are you able to host a Ukrainian family?

When hearing reports of the war in Ukraine, and the millions of Ukrainians that have been forced to flee their homeland, many have asked what they can do to help. Over 80,000 Ukrainians have already arrived to Canada through a special visa program created by Immigration Canada. An additional 500,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived. HUMANITARIAN RELIEF PAKISTAN

Since June, Pakistan has experienced three times more rainfall than an average monsoon season. Flooding and landslides have destroyed homes, crops, health centres, roads and bridges.

There is an elevated risk of the spread of malaria, dengue fever and other diseases. Priorities include clean water, shelter and health care for those directly affected by this tragic situation.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will channel donations through Catholic partners (including Caritas Canada – Development and Peace as well as the Archdiocese of Karachi) to support relief efforts underway.
